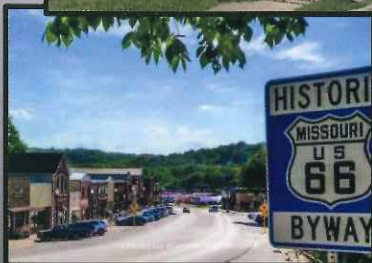


In case you missed it....

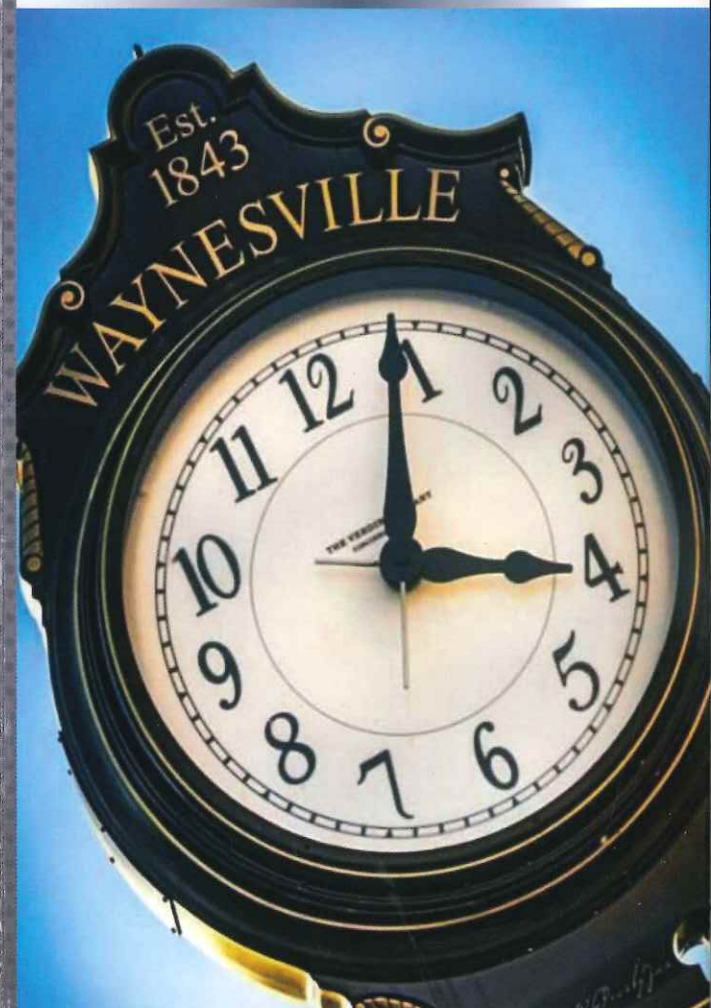
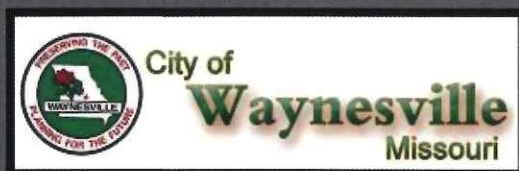

Waynesville is located along the banks of the beautiful Roubidoux nestled within the Missouri Ozarks.

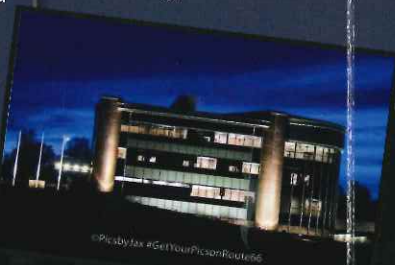
Founded in 1833, we take extreme pride in our city and we boast an economic rebirth that rivals major metropolitan areas.

Waynesville also offers state of the art medical care with the addition of the Waynesville Medical Plaza and the Waynesville Veteran's Administration Clinic.



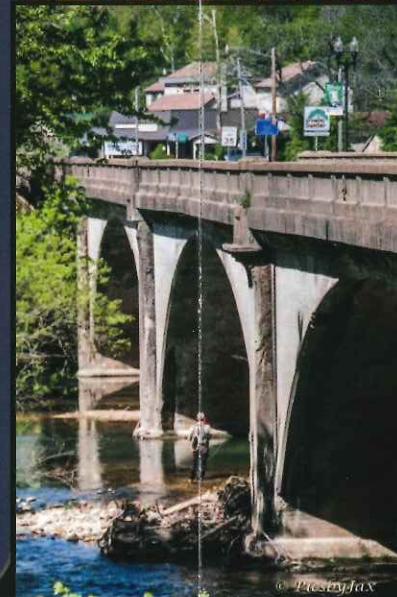

Since 1940, the City of Waynesville has shared a unique partnership and friendship with Fort Leonard Wood, home to the premier Army Center of Excellence that trains approximately 80,000 military and civilians a year.



We welcome over 100,000 visitors annually to graduations conducted on Fort Leonard Wood and call close to 7,000 military members and their families our friends and neighbors.



Waynesville is also home to the Missouri State Veteran's Cemetery, a beautiful site on 229 acres located just south of the city limits.
